1. Permit is not transferable.
2. The hunting log issued by Providence Water will serve as landowner permission and must be in hunter's possession at all times while on the property. Each hunter must return the completed hunting log to Providence Water no later than February 15, 2018. Failure to return will render individual ineligible to participate in the next Lottery to hunt deer on Providence Water property.
3. All group members must submit a copy of their 2017 RI Hunting License.
4. Permit holders will be on the property only for activities directly related to deer hunting and will not consume alcoholic beverages, start fires, or participate in any activities not related to deer hunting.
5. Hours allowed on the property are two (2) hours before sunrise to two (2) hours after sunset.
6. Only vehicles with proper registration and insurance are allowed on Providence Water property.
7. A colored placard provided by Providence Water will be placed on the vehicle's dash so it's visible through the windshield when engaged in hunting activities on Providence Water property. The colored placard, not a photocopy shall be used.
8. Travel on Providence Water access roads is at the permit holder's risk. Providence Water is not liable for any damages that may occur while on Providence Water land.
9. Permit holders will not utilize any other means of motorized transportation when on the property to include: motorcycles, dirt bikes, snowmobiles and ATVs.
10. Only stands that are properly labeled are allowed to be left on the property. The permit number must be clearly visible on the stand or on the tree it is in so it can be checked. If not properly identified, it may be removed by Providence Water personnel.
11. By signing the Liability Release Form, the permit holder agrees to abide by all the above requirements and release Providence Water from all Liability.
